

Attendance is a Priority!

The staff of Menihek High School believes that regular attendance at school is essential for a student's academic and social success. Attendance at school is compulsory under the NL Schools Act, 1997, and parents play a significant role in ensuring that their sons and daughters attend school regularly and on time.

Research supports the view that academic achievement is in direct correlation with regular attendance in school, as is working more than 20 hours per week (McNeal, 1997). Conversely, high absenteeism is one of the most important reasons for lack of success in school. Parental involvement and interest in school and learning is another factor which positively influences students' attendance at school.

Menihek High School congratulates and recognizes those students who place high priority on attending school consistently, and supports parents who place a high priority on school and education. *Thank* you!

Lateness Initiative

We are pleased with the success of our lateness initiative, and will continue to

implement it during this school year. Please note:

If a student arrives at school late first period in the morning, after recess or first period after lunch, unable to give a valid reason for his or her lateness, s/he will not be permitted to enter that class. They will attend supervised study hall for the remainder of that period, and are responsible for the work missed in their class. If there are students who continue to be late after a reasonable period of time, other consequences will be put into place for these students. Valid reasons include such things as doctor's appointments; reasons that are not valid include such things as went home for lunch and had to walk back, my ride was late, had to wait for a friend, and went out for lunch and the service was slow. This is the case even if parents are aware of their son's or daughter's lateness.

Anti-bullying Information

Bullying is repeated and aggressive behavior by a person that in intended to
