This course was developed by myself and another teacher while working in Nain. It is intended to offer students a very unique curriculum - one of outdoor knowledge and survival, safe snowmobiling, first aid, boating skills, and a combination of classroom and outdoor experiences.

Students are fully expected to participate in all events, and maintain a high level of attendance.

If a student does not meet either of those two main expectations, credits will not be granted for the course. This will be a skills based course. As such, whether or not a student receives two credits hinges on regular attendance and active participation in ALL items listed on your unit activity checklists.

The course consists of three units :

Unit One - Principles of Inosivut Education..... (Approx.12 classes)
Baseline assessment of student knowledge and skills, earth stewardship and sustainability, climate changes, seasonal changes, tidal changes, weather changes and how all impact our environmental use during activities.

Unit Two - Inosivut Skills..... (Approx. 85 classes)
Trip planning, survival kits, threats to survival, emergency shelter construction, clothing choices, navigation, fire starting, signalling, first aid course, map reading, GPS systems, safe snowmobiling course , snowmobile maintenance, controlling body heat, water quality, hunting practices and tools, fishing techniques, fish / bird / small game preparation, food borne disease, cooking.

Unit Three - Outdoor Activities..... (Approx. 12 classes)
Northern games, Labrathon challenge, safe boating course
